




USFSP Map

Duncan most recently moved from Tampa and now works out of a newly renovated tomato plant in Midtown District of St. Petersburg, FL. Duncan's processes enable him to place imagery on the inside and outside (and in some cases both) of his glass vessels. Currently, his work depicts emotions relating to family, personal growth, and spiritual connections.


